## CLERK'S REPORT

The December Session Meeting was primarily routine business. The Consent Agenda which contained the approval of the November 19 Session Meeting, the in person communion on December 8, the home communion on December 10 and also reported the death of Esther Howe on December 6, 2024. The Consent Agenda was unanimously passed.

Remaining business for the Session included the Pastor's Report which included that Pastor Dan would be on vacation for two week and study leave for one week from December 26, 2024 through January 21, 2025. It was also announced that Sierra Vista will receive a special treat on Sunday, January 19 when Crystal Echols, our Missionary in South Sudan would give a live report on her ministry and activities. The Preschool reported on their Christmas program schedule for December 16 and 17.

#### Committee reports included:

Caring Ministries – The Card ministry formerly done by Mary Ellen Cutlip has been picked up by Karen Marlatt. If you would like for your birthday and/or anniversary to be recognized with a card and listed in the newsletter, please let the church office know the dates and occasion.

Christian Education – The God and Country study course is scheduled to begin on February 16, 2025 and will run through April 13, 2025. Sign-up sheets are posted on the Don Francis Hall bulletin board. A minimum of 5 students will be required to offer the course.

Mission Activities – Arrangements for supporting ABCS Families for Christmas dinners and Christmas family gifts were noted. made.

Worship – Plans for pulpit supply while Pastor Dan is on vacation and study leave were reported.

An update on unused items around the church was given. The choir robes which have not been used for several years have been advertised to see if there are other churches within the Presbytery which could use them. So far there has been no response to that advertisement. A couple of other possibilities are being researched. Children's books from the library have been donated to First Things First. Remaining books will be made available to anyone who has an interest. Items can be picked up in library.

The Session asks for prayers for the Pastor Nominating process and the continuing work of the Session. The Annual Meeting is scheduled for January 26 immediately following the 9 am Worship Service.
