### CLERK'S REPORT

The February Session Meeting was to handle routine business.
The Consent Agenda which contained the approval of the January 21
Session Meeting minutes and the Annual Meeting minutes of January 26, 2025.
Other items on the Consent Agenda were the statement of faith for Elder-elect Sharon Brainard, the scheduling of Sharon's ordination on March 2 during the morning worship service, the service of communion on February 2, and service of Home Communion on February 6. 2024. The Consent Agenda was unanimously passed.

Remaining business for the Session included the Pastor's Report, correspondence from the clerk, and receipt and approval of the January financial report. The Trustees presented and were granted approval for several building use requests.

### Committee reports included:

Christian Education – God and County Study for the High School age group is underway. Plans for Easter celebrations were discussed.

Mission Activities – Upcoming dates for Mission Sunday - March 2 – Sandwiches for Crossroads Sunday - March 16 or 23 – Pastor Caesar visit and report

Worship – Plans for the upcoming
Ash Wednesday – March 5
Palm Sunday – April 13
Maundy Thursday – April 17
Easter Sunday on April 27 were noted.

An update on unused items around the church was given. The choir robes which have not been used for several years have been donated to Arizona Western College music department. The library books were donated to Goodwill Industries, and the room is being renovated to provide some much needed storage.

The Session asks for prayers for the Pastor Nominating process and the continuing work of the Session.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

### FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY 2025 ANALYSIS OF JANUARY REPORTS

Profit and Loss Report

#### **INCOME**

Total income received for January was \$ 15,862.81. This includes all income for the month. It includes donations in the offering plate, on-line donations through Vanco Services (\$3,928.59), the fourth quarter distribution from the Crossett and Soldwedel accounts at the Presbyterian Foundation (\$ 854.13), and the rental income from Hand In Hand preschool and the Apostolic Church (\$ 4,100.00). If there are any donations to Special Funds (such as Care Portal and Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)), they are included in income amounts but are transferred to the Restricted account immediately. Total donations to Special Funds totaled \$ 275.00 including donations to CarePortal and PDA.

### **EXPENSES**

Total expenses for January totaled \$24,169.81 including \$200.00 Designated Monies Expenses (to PDA) and \$300.00 listed as Unclassified Expenses. This category covered the costs for Esther Howe's memorial service for the Organist and the Pastor. These costs were more than covered by a family donation to the church. There were no extraordinary expenses in January but we did pay the first quarter liability insurance premium payment (\$2,744.75) and the Southwest Gas bill is larger than normal due to heat being required in the facilities.

#### **NET INCOME**

Net income is the income less the expenses. The net LOSS for the month of January is \$ 8,307.00. That is the difference between income for the month and expenses for the month. We did not transfer any funds from the Investment Account

#### **Balance Sheet**

#### **SUMMARY**

Through 2025, we have spent \$ 8,307.00 more than we have brought in. We are fortunate that we had the Investment Account. As of February 17, 2025 we have a bank balance of uncommitted funds of \$ 4,195.24. This balance recognizes the donation to Crossroads for Souper Bowl donations and a couple of outstanding checks that have not cleared yet.

Let's pray for larger than normal donations for the coming year.
