# SESSION NEWS

Your Session meets regularly each month at 6:30 pm on the third Tuesday of each month. In addition to regular business such as approval of minutes, recording events (baptisms, deaths, changes in membership) and the like, the Session has established Committees and Chairs, approved the Clerk of Session, approved the Co-Treasurers, and appointed a Delegate to Presbytery. These actions are as follow:

In addition to the above actions along with regular day-to-day concerns, the Session has entered the early phases of discernment in regards to planning for the future. According to Presbytery guidance, the Session is responsible for generating a Mission Statement (a brief description of how we see ourselves in our work and outreach) and a Mission Study – a more in-depth discussion of who we are, where we have been, demographics of the community at large and surrounding area in general, what we foresee as the potential of the church, along with potential actions that we might take to enhance growth. This Mission Study will become the guidance for the elected Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).

There are two distinct activities in play here. First is the Mission Study (the Session's responsibility), and secondly the formation and the work of a congregational called Pastor Nominating Committee. The PNC will be tasked with seeking candidates, interviewing potential candidates, listening to sermons and other materials provided by potential candidates, and eventually presenting a recommended candidate to the congregation for approval. This process is normally not a quick one. So far, as to the first activities, your Session has held multiple meetings to create the Mission Statement. We hope to have a draft Mission Statement to share with the congregation fairly soon. Once the Mission Statement is formally adopted by the Session, then the Mission Study will begin.

Much of the information for the Mission Study should be easy to build. We know who we are – we just have to articulate it. We have a chronological history that begins with the birth of Sierra Vista Presbyterian Church on December 5, 1956 all the way through the engagement of Pastor Dan Albertson to serve as the Interim Pastor on December 16, 2023. Financial history can be obtained from past Annual Reports and from our QuickBooks financial system. Other materials will have to be generated and incorporated into the Study. Our Mission Study will eventually be submitted to the Presbytery of Grand Canyon Committee on Ministry for approval and then posted into the national database to invite interested parties to respond. From past experiences, this is not an easy task, but with God's guidance and answer to prayers for patience His plan will succeed.

The Session asks for your prayers and support as we continue this process. The elected PNC (whomever they might be) also requests your prayerful support. If there are those of you who would be interested in serving on the congregational elected PNC, please let the Clerk of Session (Glen Moss) know and he will forward the interest as appropriate.



#### IN MEMORIUM

We are saddened to report the passing of two members and friends of the congregation in April: Joann Livingston who resided in La Mesa, California passed away on April 18. Joann was a member of Sierra Vista and had been active up until she moved to La Mesa to be closer to family. Joann and her husband Curly were homesteaders in the Yuma area. Their homestead is now the site known as the Livingston Estates subdivision. A memorial service may be held in late summer/ early fall pending arrangements with the family.

### OVERALL PROGRAM

We are winding down another successful year. The final day of scouts for this activity year is May 22. We have reserved the giant water slide and are planning for a fun afternoon/evening. Dinner that evening will be a pot luck from families and the program will provide lemonade, plates, napkins, and utensils, and hotdogs and buns along with condiments. Each family is requested to bring a dish to share. Suggestions include cheeses and any other popular fixings, desserts, chips, salads, and sides.
