
- 1) What do we believe?

MISSION COMMITTE NEWS

Thank you to everyone who donated new children's underwear to Crossroads Mission on Undie Sunday!

38 packages were delivered, and Gloria said the children were joyful as they helped unload the vehicle!

On Sept. 10th several of us attended the open house for AZ Baptist Children's Services (ABCS). They moved to Real Life Church on 16th St and Avenue C. They decided to move into a smaller space to cut their overhead expenses and to use the savings to help more women and children. We were happy to take a tour of the facility where they have storage for diapers, wipes, baby clothing, toys, etc. and have rooms for parenting classes and visitations for foster children and their parents. One lady in our group shared her story that she is so grateful for a place like ABCS. Because 36 years ago she needed help and went to a crisis pregnancy center thinking it was an abortion center, but they welcomed her with open arms and helped her through her pregnancy. Today she has a wonderful 35-year-old son and a granddaughter to love. And now she wants to volunteer at ABCS to help other women.

Thank you to those who donated to the Cocopah Church Men's Leadership Camp! With your donations and Mission account money we were able to give \$594 for 4 men to attend Leadership classes.

Please join us for Sandwich Making for Crossroads Mission on Sunday, October 20th after worship in Don Francis Hall. Please bring peanut butter and jelly, lunch meat, or cheese. Tuna, bread, and sandwich bags will be provided.



CLERCK'S REPORT

The September Session Meeting was convened with a discussion about the recently received approval with comments for our Mission Study. The Committee on Ministry approved the Mission Study with commendations for a job well done. They offered two comments regarding data in the Study. One comment was in regards to including a statement showing current membership and average attendance. That data was added into the Study. The second comment was in regards to one of our stated goal about growth. We had initially stated we would like to see a 50% growth in five years. It was restated to reflect a 10% growth over year for a five-year period.

The second item on the docket was a discussion about the next steps forward in the Permanent Pastor search process. It was determined that the Congregational Nominating Committee would review the membership rolls and seek candidates who might be interested in serving on a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Once a list of potential candidates is available, the Session will set a date for a Special Congregational Meeting to elect a PNC. The Congregational Nominating Committee reported that they have a list of candidates and are ready to proceed. A Special Congregational Meeting is scheduled for October 13 immediately after the morning Worship service. If you are interest in being on the ballot for the election, please contact Clerk of Session, Glen Moss at 928-580-7005 and make your wishes known.

The next item of business was the installed 86" TV in Don Francis Hall (DFH) and establishing a policy for the use of the TV by persons and groups who use DFH. The proposed policy was adopted and provides specific guidance and responsibilities for users. A copy of the policy is available by request. Let Glen Moss know that you want a copy of the policy and apply for permission to use the audio visual equipment.

As noted in the August report, there have been two activities proposed for Sierra Vista exposure to the community. These events are a "Movie Night" and a Car Show in the church parking lot. Both of these events were presented as a means to make Sierra Vista's presence more well known in the community. Any further discussions on these events will require volunteers to step up. If you are interested in attending and/or assisting with either event, please let Glen Moss know.

Remaining business for the Session included recording communion services including home communion to members Esther Howe and Mona Nelson along with two guest at the Bee Hive Home where Esther and Mona reside. Other business included an update on trustee's activities, a report from the preschool about their Open House on September 26, and a report from the Mission Committee about Undie Sunday donations.

There will be a church sponsored "Trunk Or Treat" activity on Wednesday, October 30 for the scouts, the preschool attendees, and the surrounding neighborhood. If you would like to participate by providing candy or hosting a "Trunk", please let Haley Hill know.

Please pray for the process, the work of the Session, and the soon to be started Pastor Nominating Committee work.

Yes – those figures are correct. We overspent our income by \$57,050.43

Before you panic, the expense numbers include the \$ 27,300.00 that was required to purchase the replacement air conditioner system in Don Frances Hall. The unit was paid from an investment account. The funds for the unit is not shown as "income" since it was an internal transfer of existing funding.

We were blessed at the end of 2023 to receive extra donations. Some of these donations were in payment for the donor's 2024 pledges in response to the November Stewardship Campaign, while others were distributions from personal IRAs and other Qualified investment accounts. THANK YOU for all those donations.

As you plan for the remainder of 2024 and the future, if you need a tax deduction when you file your taxes, please keep Sierra Vista in mind. We are a non-profit organization and donations to Sierra Vista are deductible for those who file itemized returns. For those retirees who may have IRAs or other investments that require a Federally mandated Minimum Distribution, that distribution can be donated tax-free to a non-profit so remember your church when planning.
